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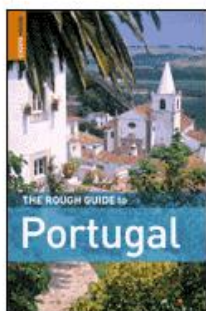
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Vila Nova de Gaia

The following are marked on the map "Vila Nova de Gaia".

Casa Adão Av Ramos Pinto 252 ☎223 750 492. Simple riverfront restaurant with low prices (around €7 for fish, even cheaper for meat). It's well used to tourists, but the food is good (though it sometimes takes an age to come) and the wine cheap. Inexpensive.

Barão de Fladgate Taylor's, Rua do Choupelo 250 ☎223 742 800. It's a punishing uphill hike, but you're rewarded by the finest river and bridge views from the terrace of Taylor's port wine lodge restaurant. A fleet of smart waiters is on hand, but it's not really formal – lovely for an *alfresco* lunch – and not too expensive either (mains around €10, though drinks soon add up). What's more, you don't see vegetarian and "light" dishes like these anywhere else in Porto – soya burger with wild rice, pasta and New Zealand mussels, or hake with steamed vegetables. Closed Sun dinner. Expensive.

Real Indiana Cais de Gaia ☎223 744 422. Upscale Indian dining – it makes a change for Porto, and the rich curries and tandoori dishes are pretty authentic (or at least pretty authentically British in style). There's also a great terrace with excellent views. Expensive.

Adega e Presuntaria Transmontana Av Diogo Leite 80 ☎223 758 380. Lovely cool, contemporary dining room with stone walls – it's typical of the newer places along here though its USP is meat rather than fish, specifically specialities from Trás-os-Montes. You can choose to eat tapas-style, from smoked meat platters, a large cheese selection and other snacks, or more substantial meals (grilled veal is one speciality, octopus another). Expensive.

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
